At Beechwood Primary School, we aim to provide learning opportunities in history which encourage children to:

- Inspire our pupils' curiosity to know more about the past.
- Understand the process of change, the diversity of societies as well as their own identity and the challenges of their time.
- Ask perceptive questions, think critically, weigh evidence, sift arguments and develop perspective and judgment.

Our history curriculum is driven by three golden threads that provide a framework for learning and help to deepen children's understanding of what is being taught from Early Years to Year 6. These threads are community and culture, achievements and legacy and migration. Alongside our explicit history units in Years 1-6, we also have *Spotlight on Crewe* units where children study the local geography and history of Crewe in both autumn and summer terms.
